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AN OHIO RACE CLASS NARRATIVE GUIDE FOR CRITICAL RACE THEORY INTRO

As some segments of our country publicly acknowledge and increasingly reckon with the ways our laws, practices and institutions harm Black, Indigenous and other people of color, the right has resorted to its usual dog whistle strategy of distraction and division. In this most recent round, they have latched onto the phrase "critical race theory" as a catch-all for their anxieties about losing power and dominance. Like with "political correctness" in the '90s and "cancel culture" today, they have made school and college campuses a primary battleground, stoking fears about how and what we teach our kids so they can undermine trust in and funding for schools and teachers.

KEY DIRECTIVES

- students deserve.



1. Seize the moral high ground and engage on our terms. With attention on education, let's talk about the teaching and curricula we support and desire.

2. Ascribe motivations to the opposition. Instead of unwittingly repeating the opposition in order to dispel their claims (e.g. "we are not teaching grade schoolers about XYZ"), talk about why they're attacking curricula and teachers.

3. Bring this back - always - to what we want as opposed to leaving us on defense against their attacks. Don't volunteer the term "critical race theory," an academic concept the right has co-opted as an all-purpose dog whistle, but when asked directly about it, define critical race theory on our terms as the honest, accurate, and up-to-date education



SAMPLE NARRATIVES

NARRATIVE 1: STRONG COMMUNITIES

Most Ohioans know we build strong communities by being good neighbors to everyone, no matter our race or background. But today, certain Ohio politicians are doing the bidding of a national network of extremist groups and greedy corporations who want to divide us by race and whitewash our history, hoping they can use the manufactured controversy to take resources from our schools and pad their own power and profits. SAMPLE NARRATIVES



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BACKGROUND & METHODOLOGY

Policy Matters Ohio and the Ohio Organizing Collaborative convened a group of activists and advocates to brainstorm elements of a Race Class Narrative message that would resonate most with Ohioans.

OHIO VALUES

The value of neighborliness/community came up the most in the brainstorming session. The related values of fairness and respect came up three times. Three people mentioned a sense of state pride and three others mentioned sports and competition, which are also related. The importance of family and children also appeared three times on the jam board. The value of hard work appeared twice.

For the purposes of crafting a message that pushes back on the manufactured attacks on Critical Race Theory, the most relevant values appear to be: **Community, Fairness & Respect, Kids & Family and a Sense of Ohio Pride.**

Suggestions:

OHIO VILLAINS

KEY INSIGHTS

Our group identified four main categories of villains: 1) Politicians, 2) National organizations and funders, 3) Pundits who serve as mouthpieces for the opposition, and 4) State and local groups. The different villains the group identified expose the truth about the fake CRT controversy: that it is a highly organized, well-funded national campaign that supports and seeds local and statewide efforts.

Research shows that the public responds best when we describe the efforts to censor teachers and erase our history as the work of corporate-backed, national efforts led by those who are enriching themselves by dividing Americans by race and place so they can siphon our public resources for their own profit.

SUGGESTIONS
